An official family care plan is required for military members and it must be kept up to date. S. I understand that I must submit the complete Family Care Plan with all attendant documents to my commander within the time limits specified by my commander (or designated representative): AA 30 days from date of this counseling session.

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*****REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL SEPARATIONS - US Army Combined ...**

A Family Care Plan is a required set of documents that outline the person(s) who shall provide care of the children, disabled, elderly, and/or other Family members who are dependent on the service member for financial, medical, or logistical support (housing, food, clothing, transportation) in the absence of the service member because of military duties.

The Family Care Plan, and any attached documentation, is filed by the service member with his or her commander. Military families who have children with special needs may consider creating a Family Care Plan to ensure that the family has "back up" in case of emergency. Why is a Family Care Plan Important?

When do I need a Family Care Plan? Requirements ...

FAMILY CARE PLAN STEP ACTION OWNER NARRATIVE 1 Commander/First Sergeant/Airmen Identification. Identify whether the Airman requires a Family Care Plan. The Airman may self-identify the need or the commander or first sergeant may determine the need based on dual military or a single parent status. The commander may also identify a special

Family Care Plan: Requirement for single-Soldier parents ...

There have been many instances where Soldiers have requested to be separated from the Army for lack of a Family Care Plan. Army Regulation 600-20, Army Command Policy, chapter 5-5, gives the requirements for a Family Care Plan and AR 635-200, Active Duty Enlisted Administrative Separations, chapter 5-8, cover the separation procedures.

Service members are responsible to ensure family members/dependents are cared for during deployments, reserve mobilizations, and temporary duty, as well as at all other times during which the service member is unavailable.
