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Heart Failure And Palliative Care

Palliative care, sometimes now referred to as supportive care, is specialized care that focuses on improving quality of life (QOL) through relief of stress and symptoms for patients with serious illness. 1 While most often associated with oncology, palliative care is appropriate for any patient in the advanced stages of illness, including patients with heart failure (HF).

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Palliative care is provided by a team of palliative care doctors, nurses and social workers. They work together with your cardiologist (heart specialist) to give you an extra layer of support. The team has a wide variety of approaches to treating congestive heart failure symptoms. These may include medicines, but not always.

Heart Failure Palliative Care for In-patient and Out-patient

Palliative care means comfort care. In palliative medicine, doctors and nurses focus on treating the symptoms of heart failure and other conditions so that patients can live as comfortably as possible. In heart failure, palliative care may be requested by the doctor when a patient shows signs or symptoms of being at the end of life.

However, even with these developments, many patients with heart failure are unlikely to benefit from a referral to expert services such as palliative care.¹ The National Service

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Framework (NSF) for Coronary Heart Disease recommends that a palliative care intervention be included in end-stage disease, and this is now widely recognised in the NHS.

This model of care has had significant benefits in reducing hospital bed days and admissions, increasing patients dying outside of hospital, providing timely support and care to improve symptoms and wellbeing for palliative patients (and their carers) with end-stage heart failure.

This RCT in Hong Kong (n=84) found that post discharge for end stage heart failure, palliative care nurse specialist support resulted in lower readmission rates at 12 weeks (33.6% v 61.0%, RR=0.55; ...

Palliative care is an interdisciplinary service and an overall approach to care that improves quality of life and alleviates suffering for those living with serious illness, regardless of prognosis.

There is extensive evidence that the distress faced by those living and dying with advanced heart failure is similar, and in many cases more severe, than those dying of cancer. Yet very few patients are referred for palliative or hospice support by their primary care or hospital cardiology teams.

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
