Mentoring and Coaching: Similar but Not the Same. Mentoring consists of a long-term relationship focused on supporting the growth and development of the mentee. The mentor becomes a source of wisdom, teaching, and support, but not someone who observes and advises on specific actions or behavioral changes in daily work.

Understanding the Role of a Mentor

First, it uses peer mentoring among college students to foster teamwork and project management skills that research shows are critical for leaders of innovation. Second, the power of ethical role models to serve as agents of change is facilitated by outside of the classroom project work in collaboration with more advanced students, alumni, and business and community leaders.

Peer Mentoring – An employee close in age to the mentee is assigned to act as a sounding board for ideas and plans, and provide guidance informally. Group Mentoring – A mentor works with a group of mentees with similar interests and needs.
