By the pigeonhole principle, the probability reaches 100% when the number of people reaches 367 (since there are only 366 possible birthdays, including February 29). However, 99.9% probability is reached with just 70 ...

So then, how do we calculate the probability of this event happening? When all of the simple events have the same probability of occurring, the probability of whichever event, A, is defined as the quotient between the number of favorable outcomes and the number of possible outcomes. This is Laplace's Rule of Succession.

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
